Books of Survey and Distribution: After the wars of the mid-seventeenth century, the English government needed solid information on land ownership throughout Ireland to carry out its policy of land redistribution. The Books of Survey and Distribution record ownership before the Cromwellian and Williamite confiscations, c.1641, and after, c.1666-68. The Books for Counties Clare, Galway, Mayo and Roscommon have been published by the Irish Manuscripts Commission. For other counties, manuscript copies are available in the National Library of Ireland, with the original copies available in the National Archives of Ireland, Bishop Street, Dublin.

Familia No. 18 has a strong internal theme of transatlantic migration to Colonial America, and not only from Ireland. David Dobson's account of Scottish migration to the new world in the eighteenth century provides a fitting context for the contributions of other writers on emigration from Ulster in the eighteenth century. William

Roulston, a Research Officer with the UHF, writes on the genealogical value of the British Parliamentary Papers, 1801-1845, a huge source which is becoming increasingly available. Macquarie University here in Sydney has the complete collection on microfilm available in its University library to all researchers and students. Reference to these Papers will help researchers broaden their knowledge of issues relating to Irish society in the nineteenth century. Familia is an excellent reference book for knowledge of Ireland, its social history and its citizens' emigration to the World.

Ulster Historical Foundation Conference 2003:

History from Headstones is the theme of this year's Family History Conference to be held in Belfast from Monday, 29 September to Saturday, 04 October, 2003. Following the success of the twelve previous conferences in the *Searching for That Elusive Irish Ancestor* series, the Ulster Historical Foundation is pleased to announce details of the next family history conference based in Belfast. The 2003 conference will take as its theme *History from Headstones*. This is the exciting new project being undertaken by the Ulster Historical Foundation, the aim of which is to show how gravestone inscriptions can be used by local and family historians to study past communities and how they changed over time. The project will be Internet based and will have a strong visual element.

Whilst the historical context provides the framework for the conference, this is primarily a genealogical event with the central purpose as always to give delegates hands-on experience of research in the main archives of both Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. While concentrating on the Public Record Office of Northern Ireland (PRONI), Belfast and the National Archives (NAI), Dublin, delegates will have ample opportunity to visit other noteworthy repositories like the National Library of Ireland (NLI), the Linenhall Library and the Presbyterian Historical Society. They will be accompanied by Dr Brian Trainor former Director of PRONI and current Research Director of UHF and will be offered free consultations from the Foundation's team of experienced researchers.

Through an extensive programme of lectures and workshops, hosted by widely acknowledged experts, delegates will receive step-by-step instruction on using the full range of documentary sources available to the family historian. They will also acquire an understanding of the historical experience and lifestyles of their forebears.

If the source is a published book, it should be available in Australia through your local library using the "inter-library loan scheme" if not available locally. Most reference books on film are also available through the LDS FH Centres, look in the Family History Library Catalog which is available to purchase and use at home. The cost of the CD ROM is about A\$8.80.
