UHF MEMBERSHIP: Its Cost and Rewards:

The ULSTER HISTORICAL FOUNDATION, Balmoral Buildings, 12 College Square East, Belfast BT1 6DD (Northern Ireland) operates the Ulster Genealogical and Historical Guild. This is a membership in which you receive two annual publications, *Familia* and *The Directory of Irish Family History Research*. As a bonus you get members' free access to databases on line at their Home Page for the year to 31 December each year. Membership becomes due for renewal each 01 January but may be renewed earlier. History from Headstones is the only database (at present) which you pay a fee to download the original cemetery transcription which may include several generations of the one gravestone. To take out new membership or to renew your membership, please go to the Ulster Historical Foundation website and subscribe (or renew) via the re-subscription form (<http://www.ancestryireland.co.uk/guild.php> and click on "Re-Join") or click on "New Member" to join for the first time. This is a secure website for the payment of memberships.

Membership of the Foundation's Guild entitles you to:

- Publicize your Irish research interests via the 'Ancestors Database' and annual 'Directory of Irish Family History Research'.
- Gain privileged access to an increasing range of searchable databases such as The Fasti of the Presbyterian Church, Illiterate Voters in Irish Boroughs in 1837, a Rent Roll for the Hertford Estate (1728) and an Unofficial (Sub-Denominational) Local Placenames List for the six Counties (and later for counties of the Republic of Ireland)
- Discounted access to Historyfromheadstones <<http://www.historyfromheadstones.com/>> UHF's new online database of almost 60,000 gravestone inscriptions which may be purchased for download or printout. The indexes may be searched for free to find your ancestors before you may purchase the complete monumental inscription which may include two or three generations.
- Reduced rates for access to the UHF Family History Research Centre and Genealogy Library in Belfast with expert help in your research.
- Share information and learn from the work of other Irish family historians.
- Receive 10% discount on all UHF book titles and benefit from other special offers.
- Receive a range of publications: '*Familia – Ulster Genealogical Review*' which contains articles on Irish history and genealogy and the '*Directory of Irish Family History Research*' (formerly entitled the Guild Interest List) which is the most complete and up-to-date record of Irish genealogical research in progress and may be updated when you prove and locate other ancestors.
- The research interests that you submit with your membership will be included in the Directory and will also be placed on the 'Ancestors Database' immediately on registering and will remain there for the duration of your subscription. Subscriptions run to 31 December each year. With the average weekly visitor numbers to our website currently reaching around 8,000, your interests will be published to a worldwide audience and, hopefully, this will enable you to contact others with related interests. In fact, the Directory has enabled many subscribers to discover others working on the same or related families and could even be a means of putting you in contact with relatives in Ireland who are not previously known to you!
- The annual Guild subscription is £20.00 sterling. Annual membership with airmail postage is £24.00. A five year subscription is available for £80.00 which includes air mail delivery of the annual publications and brochures (that is £16/year with airmail postage, a very good discount). Family history societies should find this access to databases good value for their members with their subscription. Subscribers can include up to six individuals being researched for inclusion in the *Directory*. Members can have their research interests and contact details placed on the UHF's Internet homepage. With around 8,000 visitors/day, your interests will be seen by a world-wide audience through membership of the Guild.
